ISELIN, NJ – May 17, 2013 – Three schools in Middlesex County, NJ are being recognized for their efforts to increase environmental awareness. Middlesex Water Company sponsored an Environmental Champion Award contest to recognize schools in its service area that are engaging students in programs that help to protect and preserve the environment. Middlesex Water will be presenting each school with a \$250.00 Environmental Champion Award for their special initiatives.

The 2013 Environmental Champion Schools are: **Carl Sandburg Middle School** in Old Bridge, NJ. The Environmental Club of Carl Sandberg Middle School spearheaded numerous environmental awareness projects including: a school wide poster and audio campaign which provided information on how students can reduce their individual carbon footprints and a beach clean-up as part of a Clean Communities Student Exchange Day. Students also created jewelry from recycled tabs from aluminum cans which were then fashioned into bracelets, key chains and lanyards and sold – the proceeds were then donated to the American Red Cross to assist victims of Hurricane Sandy. The Wardlaw-Hartridge School in Edison, NJ was selected for its Water Fountain Replacement Project. The school's Green Club was seeking a way to reduce waste created by the number of disposable plastic water bottles generated by students. Older water fountains were replaced with "water bottle filling stations," equipped with digital meter read-outs that show how many plastic water bottles have been replaced by students and faculty members using tap water. Students promoted their project through videos, bilingual fliers, and selling reusable water bottles to help build awareness for their initiatives. Oak Ridge Heights School #21 in Colonia, NJ is receiving special recognition for its "Show Us Your Green Lifestyle Challenge." Students became "green celebrities" by making pledges to observe environmentally friendly actions.
